FOCUS: Students will examine Steve Jenkins' illustration style, Cut Paper, using his books.

Pass Objectives:

- 1.3 Name and describe the principles of design: rhythm, balance, contrast, movement, and center of interest.
- 2.3 Demonstrate beginning skills of composition using elements of art and principles of design.

Activity: Collage uses items such as paper, fabric, wood, photos, cloth, string, small items & computer collage to create a multi-dimensional design by gluing items to a flat surface. Prepare a center with illustrators who use collage. Ask students to compare collage styles by Eric Carle, Don Freeman, David Diaz, Lois Ehlert, Pat Hutchins, David McKee, Donald Crews, Paul Goble, Leo Lionni, Ed Young, Ezra Jack Keats, Anne Jonas, Marcus Pfister & others to Steve Jenkins. Have students create their own cut paper collage works.
