Activity

What is photosynthesis?

The Curious Garden changes the city not only by making it more beautiful, but also by making it a cleaner and healthier place to live.

- 1. Explore photosynthesis and discuss why it is important.
- 2. Help students understand the process by giving them the opportunity to act out the process in small groups.
- 3. Create cards printed with the words *plant*, oxygen, carbon dioxide, sugar, water and sunlight. Give the students in each group the cards and provide them with the reference materials to help them learn about photosynthesis.
- 4. After reading about photosynthesis, ask each group to act out the process. Their goal is to show (through role-play) the part each of the cards plays in photosynthesis.

Question to tie in Curious Garden:

1. In the Curious Garden, Liam is shown singing to plants. Why might singing or talking to plants help them grow?
